This funding will be used to

Improve results and outcomes of students through differentiated and explicit teaching of writing in the curriculum.

- Improve student outcomes in English, Mathematics and Science from Prep to Year 6 to 90% of students achieving C or better, 60% of students achieving an A or B and 10% of students achieving an A by the end of Semester 2, 2021.
- Allocate time within staff meetings for intentional collaboration amongst teaching staff with a focus on refining pedagogical practices to improve the writing outcomes of our students at Forrest Beach State School.
- Continue to provide quality teaching and learning in the early years by continuing to host an eKindy pod in partnership with BUSHkids, with 4 children attending two days a week.


Our initiatives include

- Provide professional development in whole school planning processes and in analysing student data according to the Literacy Continuum and Australian Curriculum to identify individual student learning needs and next steps for quality teaching and learning.
- Develop a whole school feedback, mentoring and coaching model to build a sustainable expert teaching team, in partnership with associate Hinchinbrook small schools, and
- Provide whole school curriculum days to ensure a consistent approach to planning using the Australian Curriculum from Prep to Year 6.

Our school will improve student outcomes by

Purchasing additional teacher resources to:

- Purchase additional teaching time to support the writing outcomes of our students from Prep to Year 6.
- Purchase replacement staff so that teaching staff can attend professional development and whole school curriculum days in the improvement priority of writing.
- Purchasing replace staff so that teaching staff can be released to observe associate teachers and receive coaching and feedback in partnership with the Hinchinbrook small schools cluster, and
- Upgrade school ICT resources to support quality teaching and learning within the classroom and across the whole school.
